Keith Smith called the meeting to order at 2:00 p.m.

Comments from the Public

None.

Approval of Minutes

Ms. Sheehy made a motion to approve the December, 2019 meeting minutes. Mr. Powe seconded the motion and the motion passed unanimously.

Financial Reports

Monthly Financial Update

After reviewing the P&L, Mr. Kreiger asked for a summary of the fundraising discussed at the last meeting because he was unable to attend. He noted he was going to ask his board for a contribution, but needed to know the parameters.

Mr. Smith gave a brief recap of the information from last meeting.

Second Annual Regional Housing Summit Update

Ms. Pethia reported that a request for sponsorship was emailed to a list of organizations right before Christmas. A list of those to whom a request was made was given to the committee. If there were updates, Ms. Thomas or Ms. Jacobs would get them to the committee.

She went on to say the theme for the one-day summit will be “Housing Our Future.” The committee has confirmed Maurice Jones as the keynote speaker. The committee is hoping to find a \$15K sponsor for the gathering on the evening prior to the summit. Mr. Jones would be there to talk with the attendees in addition to his time at the summit.

She went on to give details about the breakout session as they have been brainstormed thus far.

There was discussion on how to go about getting the funding for the Summit and the networking event. Ms. Sheehy recommended there be a plan for following up with the organizations who received the request letters/emails. She also asked about the \$10,000 VHDA grant, which Ms. Pethia said has been submitted.

Mr. Gallaway asked that the list of ideas for the sessions could be shared so the committee could comment.

CVRHP Strategic Plan Update

Mr. Smith reported that there will be a draft strategic plan presented at the March meeting.

Mr. Smith said the commission is on target for the regional housing plan. There will be another written update for that in March.

He went on to say the next step for the regional housing plan is for the staff to go to the counties. Ms. Jacobs will have more time to focus on this in the near future and will have more to report at the March meeting.

Ms. Pethia said both the RHP's strategic plan, the plan for the committee itself, is being drafted and the Regional Housing Plan is also in draft form.

Legislative Liaison/Website Research

Mr. Smith has been communicating with consultants re: the website for an initial analysis. He has made contacts who may potentially do this for free. This is not a guarantee, but it is a possibility.

Mr. Smith reported that David Blount does not have the time in his schedule to assist with RHP so Mr. Smith has asked him to help get in front of legislators in Richmond or to set up one-on-one meetings with them.

Budget Discussion

There was discussion about when to bring the request for inclusion in the regional government budgets and it was determined that the sooner the committee members could bring it, the better so it would be "on the radar" for next year's consideration. It was the consensus that it probably is too late for consideration in the FY21 budgets.

Mr. Smith said he would begin discussions with the elected officials from each jurisdiction at the next TJPDC Board meeting on February 6.

Round Table Discussion

Mr. Powe met with Louisa County supervisor, Fitz Barnes, and the Louisa County administrator to further discuss affordable housing in that county.

Mr. Smith said there is a project in the works, currently in the site plan process, that is going to be 325 units with 200 of them being apartments in Fluvanna.

Mr. Smith adjourned the meeting at 3:30 p.m.

Draft Central Virginia Regional Housing Partnership: Strategic Plan

- I. **Executive Summary:** This draft plan follows extensive organizational work on the part of the Central Virginia Regional Housing Partnership (CVRHP) to identify needs in the community and create an action plan to close the regional 14,000 unit/intervention gap for affordable housing. Elements of this plan were taken from the CVRHP's Statement of Objectives, from the Strategic Planning Retreat Report (Aug. 30, 2019), and from the RHP strategic plan discussion on October 15th, 2019.
- II. **Organizational Description:** The CVRHP serves as an official advisory board, created by the Thomas Jefferson Planning District Commission, in partnership with the public, private, nonprofit, and citizen stakeholders. Composed of an overarching consortium of housing interests, the Partnership will enhance regional coordination and effectiveness to address the housing needs of the Thomas Jefferson Planning District's region, with a focus on housing production, diversity, accessibility, cost, location, design, and increasing stability for the region's residents.
- III. **Mission:** The Central Virginia Regional Housing Partnership exists to facilitate regional coordination to ensure access to affordable housing for all.
- IV. **Vision:** A 100% alignment of supply and demand of affordable housing opportunities throughout the region so that every resident can find access to safe, decent, affordable housing in communities of their choice.
- V. **Objectives:** The primary objectives of the CVRHP are to address unmet housing needs and preserve housing affordability.

To do so, the Partnership will utilize the Comprehensive Regional Housing Study and Needs Analysis to identify and support strategies to bring about the alignment of policy, funding, and programming in order to close the 14,000 affordable housing needs gap (units and interventions) and create a dynamic housing system in the region.

In order to support meeting the primary objectives, the Partnership will pursue the following opportunities:

1. Improve the collaboration across jurisdictional lines based on a common vision.
2. Further the relationship between localities.
3. Promote the inclusion of Transportation, Workforce Development, and Opportunities for Healthy Living into decisions about housing.
4. Advocate for the integration of housing into other decision making.

VI. Key Deliverables:

1. Develop a plan for education, outreach, and community engagement to support the development and implementation of regional housing strategies.
2. Create a holistic Regional Housing Plan by September 2020.
3. Develop metrics to evaluate progress over time on the strategies within the Regional Housing Plan by September 2020.
4. Create a consolidated regional policy platform for legislators to bring to the General Assembly in support of the regional housing strategies for the 2021 Legislative Session.

VII. Initial Action Plan:

1. Develop a plan for education, outreach, and community engagement to support the development and implementation of regional housing strategies.

Activities:

- a. Develop a plan for listening to residents to develop and revise the Regional Housing Plan.

Team Members: Strategies and Analysis Committee

- i. Hold housing-related stakeholder meetings and citizen community engagement meetings in each jurisdiction and deploy a digital and paper regional housing survey in each jurisdiction.

- b. Hold an annual spring Regional Housing Summit.

Team Members: Regional Housing Events Committee

- Key Goals: Educate elected officials, locality staff, housing practitioners and community members on regional housing needs, best practices in affordable housing, and innovations in policy and programming for addressing housing needs; facilitate regional coordination to develop strategies for meeting housing needs.

- c. Create a regional website.

Team Members: Website Committee

- Key Goals: Provide educational content/regional resources; Create links to available housing stock; Create a portal for residents to inform RHP and decision makers about housing challenges; Create access to and receive feedback on a regional housing legislative agenda.

2. Create a holistic Regional Housing Plan for consideration by the TJPDC by September 2020.

Activities:

- a. Develop a Regional Housing Plan that includes recommended housing chapters for each county and a regional housing component that compliments and supports the counties' plans.

Team Members: Analysis and Strategies Committee

- Key Goals: Adopt a regional approach to housing provision and preservation that enables the right housing choices in the right places and that adds up to a reduction in regional housing deficit.

- b. Review zoning codes, comprehensive plans and other key policy documents in the region.
Team Members: Analysis and Strategies Committee
 - Key Goals: To identify regional zoning and regulatory barriers to affordable housing.
- c. Work with staff to identify zoning and regulatory barriers that promote healthy living.
Team Members: Analysis and Strategies Committee
 - Key Goals: To develop solutions to address zoning and regulatory barriers to healthy living.

3. *Develop metrics to evaluate progress over time on the strategies within the Regional Housing Plan by September 2020.*

Activities:

- a. Develop clear metrics for each sector of the housing system.
Team Members: Strategies and Analysis Committee
 - Key Goals: Ensure measurable progress on the regional strategies to address housing needs
- b. Develop a dashboard to report on progress over time.
Team Members: Strategies and Analysis Committee
 - Key Goal: Make information accessible to the community.

4. *Create a consolidated regional policy platform for legislators to bring to the General Assembly in support of the regional housing strategies for the 2021 Legislative Session.*

Activities:

- a. Review 2020 Legislative Priorities to identify common initiatives.
Team Members: Executive Committee
 - Key Goals: Identify regional housing legislative priorities.
- b. Develop regional legislative priorities that align and/or overlap with jurisdictional legislative priorities.
Team Members: Executive Committee
 - Key Goals: Impact legislation in 2021
- c. Create a legislative round table.
Team Members: Executive Committee
 - Key Goals: Have an ongoing forum to update legislative platform as new ideas emerge and as necessary enabling legislation is identified in code audits; Help municipalities achieve the tools they need to realize their goals around zoning and policy related to affordable housing.
- d. Develop a plan to regularly engage legislators from Region 10.
Team Members: Executive Committee
 - Key Goals: Sponsorship and support of key legislation.

Maurice A. Jones was appointed CEO and President of the Local Initiatives Support Corporation (LISC) in September of 2016. LISC is one of the country's largest organizations supporting projects to revitalize communities and catalyze economic opportunity for residents. Prior to joining LISC, Maurice was the Secretary of Commerce and Trade for the Commonwealth of Virginia where his primary job was to utilize Virginia's assets to solidify its position as the preeminent place to live, work and conduct business.

Maurice previously served as Deputy Secretary for the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) from April 2012 through January 2014. As the second most senior official at HUD, Maurice managed the

Department's day-to-day operations, the annual operating budget of \$40 billion and the agency's 8,900 employees.

Before his appointment at HUD, Maurice was President of Pilot Media, the largest print and digital organization in Hampton Roads, Virginia. He joined Landmark Media Enterprises, owner of Pilot Media, in 2005, serving as Vice President of the Landmark Publishing Group. In 2006, he became the Vice President and General Manager of Pilot Media, and in 2008 he became President and Publisher of The Virginian-Pilot.

Maurice also served as the Commissioner of the Virginia Department of Social Services and Deputy Chief of Staff to then-Virginia Governor Mark R. Warner. Other positions include: Special Assistant to the General Counsel at the U.S. Treasury Department, Legal Counsel to the Community Development Financial Institutions (CDFI) Fund and Director of the Fund during the Clinton Administration, Associate Attorney at Hunton & Williams in Richmond, Virginia, and Partner at Venture Philanthropy Partners.

Maurice received a Bachelor of Arts in Political Science from Hampden-Sydney College and attended Oxford University in England on a Rhodes Scholarship, where he received a Master of Philosophy in International Relations. He later received a Juris Doctor from the University of Virginia.

Housing needs have been identified as an immediate and ongoing priority for our regional community.

As you know, in April of 2019, the Central Virginia Regional Housing Partnership (CVRHP) held its first annual Regional Housing Summit hosting 170 participants. That first summit was immensely successful because of the valuable information shared, the networking between government officials and members of the private and non-profit sectors, and thanks to our sponsors, without whom the summit could never have existed.

The CVRHP consists of 21 voting members from the public, private, nonprofit, and citizen sectors. They will address, through advisement, the housing needs of the Thomas Jefferson Planning District's region, with a focus on housing production, diversity, accessibility, cost, location, design, and increasing stability for the region's residents. Support for the creation of a Regional Housing Partnership has been extremely favorable.

In 2019, a Comprehensive Regional Housing Study and Needs Assessment identified that the region's affordable housing needs impact 17,239 households, to include: the number of cost-burdened renters and homeowners spending more than 30 percent of their income on housing, replacement of existing assisted housing units in poor condition, and housing needs to accommodate homeless individuals with families. The report indicated that the affordable housing needs for the region is expected to be closer to 21,260 by the year 2040. The need for housing is a universal issue.

On July 8, 2020, the CVRHP is planning to host *Housing Our Future: The Second Annual Regional Housing Summit* at the Omni Hotel in Charlottesville, VA. The goals of the summit are to 1) better inform all stakeholders of the regional impacts of housing, and 2) help direct the CVRHP to develop a Regional Housing Strategy to improve all housing needs, including: homeless, affordable, and market rate. The summit will host 150-200 attendees from throughout the region. **We are, again, seeking your help to raise \$70,000 to host the summit.**
