
WHAT WE RECYCLE

In 2021, residents in the Thomas Jefferson Solid Waste District (TJSWD) generated close to 133,778 tons of trash. Of this amount, roughly 48,855 tons were recycled or composted. The TJSWD is comprised of the counties of Albemarle, Greene, Fluvanna and the City of Charlottesville. Greene 13%

REGIONAL RECYCLING

The Thomas Jefferson Planning Commission coordinates solid waste planning efforts through the Thomas Jefferson Solid Waste Planning Unit (SWPU). Current members of the SWPU include Albemarle, Charlottesville, Fluvanna and Greene. These jurisdictions are included in the Regional Solid Waste Management Plan. As part of the plan requirements, TJPDC conducts an annual inventory of solid waste and recycling activities. This inventory is used to ensure that SWPU meets the state requirement of a 25% minimum recycling rate. Data in the report is sourced from permitted solid waste facilities, large solid waste producers, haulers, and recyclers. . The table below summarizes recycling efforts by locality. Note: Charlottesville and Albemarle are combined.
